### B.C. SUMMER AND WINTER GAMES HOSTS ANNOUNCED

The provincial government has announced today that the City of Kelowna will host the 2026 BC Summer Games from July 23rd-July 26th, 2026 and Quesnel will be the host for the 2024 BC Winter Gamers from February 22nd-25th, 2024.

"Congratulations to the host cities for the 2024 and 2026 BC Winter and Summer Games. This is a wonderful opportunity for these cities to showcase their 'A games' as a sports event-hosting destination and to support B.C.'s young athletes," said Melanie Mark, Minister for Tourism, Arts, Culture and Sport.

The BC Games are organized and staged by a community Board of Directors with up to 3,000 volunteers supporting this year. The games are considered to be a stepping stone for many athletes on their journey towards the Olympic Games. Kelowna is certainly no stranger to hosting major sporting events, as the community has hosted three BC Summer Games in 1980, 1994, and 2008. They also hosted the 2019 55+ BC Games and Skate Canada International.

Mayor Colin Basran, City of Kelowna shared "With five Kelowna athletes competing at the Olympics right now, we understand the value of these events to growing athletes. These Games give the best emerging high-performance athletes a chance to show their skills in serious competition and we are thrilled to be able to host these games here in Kelowna."

The BC Summer Games have shown to be a crucial developmental milestone for many of the province's up and coming high-performance athletes. With over 3,700 participants between athletes, coaches, managers, and officials over 18 sports, many athletes see this as a first step towards success at the Olympic Games. Megan Osland (Golf) and Malindi Elmore (Athletics) competed at the BC Summer Games as a first step towards success at the Olympic Games.

"I know personally the power sport has had in my life, and I am proud to continue to shine a light on B.C.'s top athletic talent. Our government's continued support to the BC Games Society enables them to deliver these games and ensures our athletes can reach their dreams."



The age range of athletes can be anywhere from 9 years old to 19 years old. Certain sports can only be entered by certain age groups, the average age of athletes being 14 years old. The games also have a huge impact both on the community and economy. The games require over 3,000 volunteers in order to host which is a great opportunity for those looking to help and be a part of the BC Games. It's also expected that the games will bring in over \$2 million for the economy.

"The 2024 and 2026 BC Games will bring new opportunities for sport and community development, but it is the collective hosting expertise, skills and qualities of community volunteers that will make each game a unique and memorable experience for participants. We look forward to working with the communities of Quesnel, Maple Ridge and Kelowna."

# RECORD BREAKING TEMPERATURES BRING WARNINGS TO THE VALLEY

Residents in the Columbia Valley are being urged to stay indoors and cool as we are expecting more high temperatures to come.

A heat warning and air quality statement has been issued by Environment Canada with the heat warning in effect for the Columbia Valley, Kimberley, and Cranbrook communities. A special air quality statement has been issued for Cranbrook, Kimberley, Elk Valley and Kootenay National Park areas.

The risks of high temperatures impact children, those who are pregnant, older adults, those with chronic illnesses, and anyone working or exerting activity outside. Be aware of the symptoms of heat related illnesses such as swelling, rash, cramps, fainting, heat exhaustion, and/or heat stroke. Keep yourself hydrated by drinking plenty of water and staying as cool as you can. Try going outside during the coolest parts of the day and shade yourself with an umbrella or hat.

The wildfire smoke has also done nothing to help matters. Increased smoke in the air can cause coughing, throat irritation, headaches, or shortness of breath. Take extra precautions to reduce your exposure to Wildfire smoke. The smoke that is released from wildfire is always changing the particles, gases, and chemicals it includes, many of which can be harmful for your health.

"A strengthening ridge of high pressure will lead to rising temperatures across interior B.C. Daytime highs near 35 degrees Celsius combined with overnight lows near 18 degrees are forecast for today and Saturday," Environment Canada stated.

"The risks are greater for young children, pregnant women, older adults, people with chronic illnesses and people working or exercising outdoors," said Environment Canada. "Check on older family, friends and neighbours. Schedule outdoor activities during the coolest parts of the day. Seek a cool place such as a tree-shaded area, swimming pool, shower or bath, or air-conditioned spot like a public building."

# WE CAN'T FLY.

### When you fly a UAV or drone near or over a **#BCwildfire**, you're breaking the law and endangering firefighting personnel.

The restricted airspace includes a radius of five nautical miles around the fire and to an altitude of 3,000 feet above ground level. Transport Canada and the BC Wildfire Service explicitly prohibit the use of UAVs or drones of any size near a wildfire.

### Lake Windermere Ambassadors to Develop Sustainable Funding with CVCF

If you're out on the waters of Lake Windermere on a Tuesday morning, you may see a team of volunteers getting water quality samples from the lake. These are the Lake Windermere Ambassadors (LWA), a group of concerned citizens, from diverse backgrounds, interested in directing water monitoring and stewardship of Lake Windermere. The Ambassadors conduct water monitoring and community outreach to realize their vision of *Healthy Waters for Healthy Communities*.

The work of the Ambassadors builds on the successes of the Lake Windermere Project, which took place from 2005 to 2009. The Lake Windermere Project accumulated water monitoring equipment, an extensive library, and knowledge on lake monitoring protocols. These resources are now available to the community through the Lake Windermere Ambassadors.

As a non-profit and charitable organization, reliable and consistent funding is often a challenge. In seeking such incomes, the LWA approached the Columbia Valley Community Foundation (CVCF) to set up a designated Endowment Fund. This type of fund invests all principal donations through specialized and advantageous investment streams. The annual interest income from this investment provides reliable and consistent funding to the organization.

# DR. BONNIE HENRY RECEIVES PROVINCE'S HIGHEST HONOUR

Dr. Bonnie Henry has played a pivotal role in the province's ongoing COVID-19 pandemic response and is now one of 16 people being appointed to receive the Order of British Columbia.

She is joined by others such as Indigenous leaders, philanthropists, artists and business and community trailblazers. Other appointees named are: Chief Joe Alphonse of the Tsilhqot'in Nation, Vancouver artist Joe Average, Lawyer Marvin Storrow and finance industry leader Debra Doucette.

The premier of British Columbia, John Horgan, released a statement congratulating the 16 appointees for their contributions to their communities, their leadership, and dedication. Since the inception of this honour, 475 people have been appointed to the Order of B.C.

The Tsilhqot'in Nation released a statement celebrating the appointment of Chief Alphonse, who helped lead the nation's Supreme Court of Canada land title victory in 2014.

"Chief Alphonse has inspired and empowered Indigenous peoples around the world, and today, the Tsilhqot'in Nation celebrates and thanks him for his many contributions," says the nation.

This funding is being provided to help educate people on the colonial past of our province and move towards reconciliation while promoting inclusivity and diversity.

"The First Peoples' Cultural Foundation and the First Peoples' Cultural Council work in tandem on the revitalization of Indigenous languages," said Lorna Wánosts'a7 Williams, chair, First Peoples' Cultural Foundation.

"We turn now to revitalizing our cultural heritage by focusing on the documentation, archiving and sharing the precious stories, knowledge and wisdom of the Elders and Knowledge Keepers for future generations to come."

## DRAGON AGE SERIES REPORTEDLY IN ACTIVE DEVELOPMENT

**BIOWARE'S POPULAR ACTION RPG GAME SERIES TAKES PLACE** ON THE FICTIONAL CONTINENT OF THEDAS AND FOLLOWS THE EXPERIENCES OF THE FANTASY CREW THAT INHABIT THE VAST MYSTICAL WORLD.

Looks like Netflix is looking to capitalize on it's video game series success that it saw from The Witcher series. They are reportedly working on a Dragon Age series which showcases the epic fantasy universe of the BioWare game franchise. Although neither Netflix or Bioware have officially confirmed the report, word has come from a proven and trust-worthy source that the series is currently in active development at Netflix.

Very little is known about the adaptation at this point. Will it be an original story set in the fantasy universe of the acclaimed video game series? Or will they utilize some of the existing story? There's also no confirmation on whether the series will be live-action or animated, which will play a big part in how the show is received. In my opinion, this needs to be a re-telling of the fabled story of the Darkspawn War. Where the Grey Wardens fought in battle and the story of the universe can really be told and then expanded on for years to come. Also allowing for more original ideas to come out of the content that already exists.

Word of the series has allegedly come from a "trusted and proven" source, however, very little is known about the adaptation at this point – particularly in regards to whether the show would take an animated approach, much like Castlevania, or whether it would be a live-action affair, similar to The Witcher, though the report seems to indicate that it could be the latter.

The franchise has spawned numerous spin-off games alongside its main series titles, including Dragon Age 4, which is currently in development.




