

SLEDGE SKATE OF HOPE COMES TO INVERMERE

Tyler McGregor, a Paralympian and World Sledge Hockey champion is using Terry Fox's Marathon of Hope as inspiration for the 2023 Sledge Skate of Hope. Terry Fox's quote "It has to keep going without me" is the first thing you will see on the sledgeskateofhope.com home page, Tyler's 2023 goal is to skate his sled 42 km in each of the Canadian provinces to raise \$100,000 for the Terry Fox Foundation, continuing to do just that and keeping Terry's wish alive. This is Tyler's 2nd Sledge of Hope with the first being in 2021 in which he skated for 25km and raised \$31, 329 in Ontario's Blue Mountains.

The Sledge Skate of Hope honours Terry Fox's legacy and help raise funds for cancer research to find a cure. Tyler is doing the sledge skate for all those in the hospitals fighting for their lives.

For the 2023 Sledge Skate of Hope, Tyler's Is kicked off the journey in Halifax, January 3rd. With some rescheduling due to the unpredictable Canadian weather, Invermere has moved up to the 3rd leg on January 23rd and will be 8:00am at the Whiteway.

In addition to raising funds for the Terry Fox Foundation, Tyler is a Captain on Team Canada's Para hockey team with a lengthy list of accomplishments which include two Paralympic silver medals, a bronze, two World Championship golds and His determination to four silver. continue in the sport had him back on ice in 2011 after being diagnosed with cancer and having amputation in 2010. His first Team Canada national medal came at age 18 with a World Silver. That same determination has him expanding his 2021 Sledge Skate of hope from 1 province to 10 and increasing his fundraising goal from \$25,000 to \$100,000. Tyler McGregor amazina Canadian representative in sport on the national stage and is channeling that into his work on bringing awareness not only to his cancer research fund raising but providing future inspiration to others either fighting or recovering and showing that you can stay involved in sport and give back to help others.

CHANGES COMING FOR HOW CITY PROVIDES PUBLIC NOTICES

City of Cranbrook council passed three readings Monday night to Public Notice Bylaw 4099, 2023, which allows a council to determine alternative methods of public notice.

Currently, the city is not in compliance with certain notification requirements under the Local Government Act as there are only two newspaper publications which only publish once a week, reported Santana Patten of Engineering and Development Services.

"Adopting a Public Notice Bylaw will bring the city in compliance with the statutory requirements for public notice, will prepare for a time when there might not be a newspaper at all, and allow the city to use the other available channels. Expanding the locations of the public notification will likely reach a further audience and those who do not utilize conventional news streams," Pattern stated.

Section 94.2 of the Community Charter was updated in February 2022 to allow for a council to determine, by bylaw, alternative notice requirements. Section 94.2 provides local governments the authority to adopt a public notice bylaw if they choose not to use the default notice provisions.

Ktunaxa Ready

Local governments that adopt a public notice bylaw must then publish notice by all the methods specified in the bylaw, and are still required to post a notice at the public notice posting places, the city staff report said.

The notice requirements suggested are minimum requirements and are not intended to limit council's discretion to direct staff to provide additional notices, utilizing different or additional methods or repeating notice, as may be deemed appropriate by council, Patten outlined in the report.

Council unanimously passed the first three readings of Public Notice Bylaw 4099, 2023. Coun. Wes Graham was absent from the meeting.

The number of homes sold in the Kootenay-Boundary last year dropped 23 per cent over 2021, but a representative of a realtors group says it was still "a fairly good year."

"Like other regions in the province, in the Kootenays we had a strong start to 2022 but with rising interest rates, market activity started to decline from the peak in April," said Bruce Seitz of the Association of Interior Realtors. "Market conditions remained tight due to low inventory."

In 2022, a total of 3,066 homes changed hands in the Kootenays. Average prices remained flat but stayed above the \$500,000 mark for most of the year. By December, they had dropped to \$445,000, the lowest they had been in over a year.

Displaced Ukrainian families who left Europe for Cranbrook celebrated their holiday season with a community dinner featuring cultural dishes, Christmas carols and traditional garb on Sunday (Jan. 8) evening at Christ Church Anglican.

The event, organized directly by the families, served both as an expression of gratitude to the Cranbrook community, which has stepped up in countless ways to support the Shelter for Ukrainians Society, while also doubling as the monthly vigil in solidarity with Ukraine against Russia's military invasion.

The evening also celebrated Ukrainian Orthodox Christmas, which is marked on Jan. 7 according to the Julian calendar (as opposed to the Gregorian calendar, which marks the date on Dec. 25).

Tetiana Sokolenko, who came to Cranbrook as a student a few years before the war broke out, said the families wished to do something to thank the community and people involved with the Shelter for Ukrainians Society.

"We decided it'd be a great thing to create a holiday, something special for our directors, for Canadian volunteers and everyone who has been participating to help Ukrainians," said Sokolenko. "So we did it as a secret from all the directors."

CARTAGENA

With an old town surrounded by colonial-era fortifications built by the Spanish (and a Miami-esque skyline as well), Cartagena is both a stunning time capsule on the shores of the Caribbean Sea and a contemporary mecca for sun-seekers. Blessed with abundant tropical fruits and fresh fish, cuisine in Cartagena is often a delicious fusion of Caribbean, Mediterranean and international influences, and the slew of new modern restaurants have brought the food scene to the next level. And with world-class music, a strong cultural focus on film and literature (Nobel Prize-winning Colombian author Gabriel Garcia Marquez kept a home here) and chic shops and hotels like Casa San Agustin and Sofitel Legend Santa Clara Hotel, the lure of this seaside city is undeniable.

Cartagena was always a desirable conquest for pirates and enemies of the Spanish Crown; and for this reason, the defense of the city from these threats was a question of priority for its inhabitants from the first decades of the existence of the city. Once the primitive nucleus of Cartagena and the outlying district of Getsemani were fortified, there was a

need to erect a structure on San Lazaro Hill that would prevent an enemy attack from its peak, since the hill dominated the walls and the only entrance to the city, the Media Luna Entrance in Getsemani. In addition, this hill was the intermediate point between the city and the nearby Popa Peak, where some heavy guns and canons were installed between 1769 and 1780 to cross fire with the castle and make an enemy attack more difficult from the large beach of Playon Grande in Pie de la Popa.

Location: Cartagena, capital of Bolívar departamento, northern Colombia, at the northern end of Cartagena Bay.

Best time to visit: December to April. The city's tropical climate means that, although temperatures tend to stay around the mid-80s year-round

How to reach: Cartagena Rafael Nunez Airport

All flights to Cartagena land at Cartagena Rafael Nunez Airport. The airport code is CTG, and it can also be referred to as Rafael Nunez or Rafael Nuñez Intl.



MACHU PICCHU, PERU

No matter how many photos you've seen of Machu Picchu, nothing comes close to the real thing. You can get to the citadel in under a day, but consider a five-day trek for the full Inca trail experience. The route takes you along panoramic mountain passes, ancient walls, and winding rivers before you can finally set your well-deserved sights on this ancient wonder of the world.

This 15th-century Inca citadel, cradled between two Andean mountain peaks, comprises expertly constructed agricultural terraces soaring out of the mist. April marks the end of the rainy season-and right before peak season kicks off-so there will be fewer tourists than usual. Rest vour feet at Panorama B&B in Machu Picchu Pueblo, which is the gateway town for more treks to the Inca ruins.

Location: Machu Picchu, also spelled Machupijchu, site of ancient Inca ruins located about 50 miles (80 km) northwest of Cuzco, Peru, in the Cordillera de Vilcabamba of the Andes Mountains.


Best time to visit: One of the best times to visit Machu Picchu is April and May; the rainy season has passed, the mountains are emerald

How to reach:

- 1. First, you need to get to Cusco.
- 2. Then, from Cusco, you can choose to ride the train or trek. Most travelers enjoy the comfortable train ride to the Machu Picchu Station in Aguas Calientes.
- 3. Finally, take a short bus ride from Aguas Calientes to Machu Picchu for your tour.

GERMAN HEFEZOPF

This German Hefezopf is perfect for Springtime baking: as it's still cold enough outside to enjoy being next to a warm oven, while the birds sing outside in the sunshine. I especially like seasonal baking for a special occasion. And the Easter Weekend is a very good one!

Ingredients

For the dough:

- 250ml cream
- 550g flour
- 1 sachet dried instant yeast (7g)
- 80g sugar
- 1 tosp vanilla sugar
- a pinch of salt
- 2 eggs
- 1 egg white

For the filling:

- 200g ground almonds
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 50g cassonnade
- 3 tbsp rum (or water) 2 tbsp water
- 1 egg

apricot jam or quince jelly, to brush pearl sugar, to decorate

Directions

Prep: 25mins

- Resting time: 30mins

- Baking time: 35 mins

- Makes 2 loaves of 30cm

Heat the cream in a saucepan or microwave until it's warm to the touch but not too hot to burn yourself.

Put the flour, yeast, sugar, vanilla sugar and salt into a bowl and give it a stir. Add the cream and knead with the kneading attachment of a standalone mixer. Add the egg and egg white after a few seconds, then knead for 5 minutes.

Shape the dough into a ball and cover the bowl with a teatowel. Leave the dough to rise in a warm place for 1 hour.

Meanwhile, prepare the filling by mixing all the filling ingredients together in a bowl.

After 1 hour, turn the dough onto a flour-dusted work surface and roll into a rectangle approximately 40x35cm.

Spread the filling over the rectangle. Roll up the dough starting at the long side. Cut into two logs, then cut each log lengthwise into two, so that the filling is open.

Take two cut-open pieces and lay them on a baking tray lined with baking paper, twist them so that they look like a braid. Repeat with the remaining dough and put the second loaf next to the other on the same baking tray.

Cover the baking tray with a teatowel and leave to rest for another 30 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 160°C fan.

After 30 minutes, remove the teatowel and bake the loaves for 35 minutes.

Meanwhile, melt the apricot jam or quince jelly.

As soon as the loaves come out of the oven, brush the hot loaves with the melted jam or jelly and sprinkle with pearl sugar. Transfer onto a wire rack and leave to cool completely before serving.

RASPBERRY PEACH CHAMPAGNE COCKTAIL

Peach vodka, fresh raspberry syrup and champagne are combined to make this gorgeous Mother's Day Raspberry Peach Champagne Cocktail. Sweet, bubbly and full of fresh, fruity flavors, this is the perfect cocktail to serve at a Mother's Day brunch or any special occasion.

Ingredients

For the Raspberry Syrup (makes 1 1/4 cups/300ml):

- 1 cup (200g) white sugar
- 1 cup (240ml) water
- 1 cup (125g) raspberries
- 10 dashes peach bitters (optional)
- For the Champagne Cocktail:
- 1 oz peach vodka (see notes if you don't have peach vodka)
- 3/4 cup (180ml) raspberry syrup
- 1 bottle of chilled champagne
- Raspberries to serve

Instructions

To make the raspberry syrup:

Put the sugar, water and raspberries in a small saucepan and bring to a boil on a medium heat.

One boiling, reduce to a simmer and simmer for 10 minutes. Stirring occasionally.

Remove from the heat and add the bitters, stir. Transfer to a jar or bottle and leave to cool. Can be stored in a sealed jar/bottle for up to 2 weeks in the fridge

To make the cocktail:

Set out 4 champagne coupe glasses (if using flutes, please see note)
Add 1/4 oz peach vodka to each glass
Add 1.5 oz/3 tbsp/45ml raspberry
syrup to each glass
Top up with champagne
Add fresh raspberries to each glass
Serve straight away



Once in a while, a game comes along that effortlessly combines near flawless gameplay, a wonder filled world, incredible tonesetting music, and unique and stunning art direction.

This year that game is from Software's Elden Ring, this dark fantasy action RPG that channels the best aspects of the studio's last decade of work into one enormous package. This insanely ambitious open world captivated my curiosity, it stumped me with its puzzles, secrets, and mysteries. The game has served up unbelievably satisfying moments as I experienced one of the most extraordinary

adventures of all time. From my initial start into the world to the final moments, every step of the journey is a note in a personalized grand journey that kept me coming back for more. This trek through a dark and twisted fantasy is an endless exploration, continually serving up sensational sights that only get more enthralling and fantastic as the voyage goes on.

STORY

- -Elden Ring has a dark fantasy setting that takes place in the "Lands Between".
- Features many characters and lore hinted at in past Dark Souls games.
- But it's still primarily about combat, not talking to NPCs.

The Elden Ring world is full of discovery, and while a clear path forward exists is not always the most obvious, There are several online walkthroughs to help you plan your journey. Roaming the lands unfettered without a particular goal in mind often yields surprises, though more often than not those surprises will kill you if you're not prepared. Elden Ring is not a theme park-style open world where each ride is bolstered by breadcrumbs, so they won't be missed. There are significant areas, bosses, dungeons, and other huge revelations that can be passed by, making these finds even more delightful. Even after over 2 days of gameplay, I know that I've missed plenty cool sights. Instead of crying over what I haven't found, yet, I'm inspired to keep exploring. grandiose world is chock-full of characters, quests, and various dungeon crawls ranging from tiny catacombs to massive multilayered tombs. While the journey starts with little caves, mines, and other smaller dungeons, these experiences become more complex and insanely harder to clear. Two-room affairs eventually become intricate teleport puzzles or scenarios where you discover unusual ways to interact with the environment, like learning to use traps for traversal or sniffing out secret walls.

Veterans of Software games will find themselves at home in Elden Ring quickly. The combat fundamentals are as strong as ever, while still meaning to be completely infuriating. You need to manage your stamina, picking your moment to strike or dodge. Blindly attacking will leave you tired and vulnerable in the path of enemies who hit hard, slicing your health bar to nothing in just a few strikes. You want to make sure you are ready and blocking their attack or not in the path of their weapon at all. Leveling up works pretty much the same way as it did in Dark Souls, tasking you to battle your way from checkpoint to checkpoint and spend your hard-earned experience points to level up as you do. The only difference is that experience points are now called Runes, rather than Souls, and the checkpoints are now called sites of grace, instead of bonfires.

Your character incredibly is customizable, which I found highly rewarding. You can attach various skills and scaling mechanics across the board, allowing you to truly create your own vision of a traveling hero. Re specialization and alterations allow you to finely tweak your creation without worrying too much about experimentation along the way as you arm yourself with everything from explosive pots to potent perfumes to your complement ever-growing arsenal. Combat will vary greatly from player to player and build to build, but the precise dance of melee combat is more refined and diverse than ever.

You can now even bring summonable monsters to battles, Pokemon style, called Spirit ashes. Underneath all of Elden Ring's lore and world design, there's a simple joy to smashing enemies with a big sword underneath or cutting them to pieces with your Whips of doom.



Mansion of Evil Netflix's Wednesday



Wednesday' review: Netflix Addams Family spinoff is Dark, Spooky and all sorts of kooky.

There is only one thing to keep in mind before watching Netflix's Addams Family, it's to expect the unexpected. Yes, the look - pigtails, pale skin, pinstripes - is similar to the '90s classic. Yes, she remains pofaced and prickly. Yes, it's still set in a creepy mansion. But dip a toe beyond the first few episodes, and you'll find a very different Wednesday to the one we've come to know.

It all starts with a long car journey. Our queen of mean is in serious trouble after setting killer piranhas on some school bullies, costing them their lives. As a result, she's being packed off to Nevermore academy in the mountains.

Nevermore Academy is the alma mater of her mother, Morticia (Catherine Zeta-Jones), and father, Gomez (Luis Guzmán). Its curriculum is designed for outcasts, creeps and monsters, and the student body is filled cliques of vampires, with werewolves and sirens. But even they're freaked out by Wednesday's cadaver-white skin and all-black uniform. "Wednesday always looks half-dead," explains Gomez. "Please excuse Wednesday. She's allergic to color," adds Morticia. The school's suspiciously cheerful Principal Weems (Gwendoline Christie) has no intention of going easy on Wednesday.

Ortega kills as the prodigal teen who'd rather hang out in a crypt than a club. She embodies Wednesday with her flat affectation and utter disdain for her peers and life. Her goth inspired, zombie-like moves at the school dance to the tune of the Cramps' "Goo Goo Muck" – with a deadly straight face, nonetheless created one of the top television most iconic moments of the year.

The black hearted heroine is sadistic. fearless and full of awesome sardonic one-liners. When describing how she's plagued by visions, Wednesday says, "They come on without warning and feel like electroshock therapy, but without the satisfying after burn." She doesn't have an Insta or account because she finds "social media to be a soul-sucking void of meaningless affirmation." And when her flamboyantly perky new roomie Enid (Emma Myers) gives her a tour of the school's social scene, Wednesday makes it clear that she's not interested in "tribal adolescent clichés." (You will performance Myers' character by the time the series is done.) Wednesday puts her inherent distrust of humankind to use when a mysterious creature with ties to the school starts killing off students and townsfolk. Like a gothic Nancy Drew, she relies on her powers of deduction – and the occasional torture session – to solve the mystery.

who Christina Ricci, played Wednesday in the 1991 film "The Addams Fámily" and its 1993 sequel, "Addams Family Values," Nevermore's academy "normie" teacher, Ms. Thornhill. She doesn't have morphing skills or powers like the others. Her passion for teaching botany is what brought her to the school? You get the feeling pretty quickly she is not exactly what she seems.

Gimmicky callbacks to the films and the 1964 TV series are rare and strategically deployed in this iteration of the franchise. Two snaps of the finger unlock the door to a secret society's lair, and Lurch's catchphrase, "You rang?," only surfaces once and with perfect timing.


Thing, the creepy little hand with the loyalty and tenacity of a mastiff is the Watson to Wednesday's Sherlock. Thing's Expressions of shame, alarm dejection are a full-bodied performance thanks to the wonders of CGI. Wednesday interrogates Thing when she discovers it hiding in her dorm room on the first day of school. "Mother and Father sent you to spy on me, didn't they?" He signals "no" with the wag of a digit. "I'm not above breaking a few fingers," she warns. Thing quakes, then quickly explains in sign language that it's there for her own good. "Oh, Thing, you poor, naive appendage," she says mockingly.

As much as Wednesday is an absorbing murder mystery, it's also very much a coming-of-age story. The series puts a modern twist on a classic character, portraying even more of Wednesday's quirks and nuances. Ortega is an absolute delight in the role, channeling Wednesday's deadpan humor and morbid interest in death effortlessly.

Burton's preferences and style are all over this irresistibly quirky, sardonic series. Nevermore Academy is a beautifully ghoulish place, replete with gargoyles and spires, while the small historic town of Jericho outside draws tourists in with a cheesy re-creation of a Pilgrim village. The mix of witchburning artifacts and kitsch fudge stands is a Burton playground.

There's always a fine line when messing with a beloved pop culture institution like "The Addams Family," but "Wednesday" is brilliant on every level. Its namesake doesn't have to worry about her reputation being sullied.

Not like she'd ever care what we think anyway.






