Ingredients

- 2 TBSP veast
- 1 cup warm water
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1/3 cup canola oil
- 1 egg 1 1/2 tsp salt
- 3-31/2 cups flour
- 1 egg whisked with 1 TBSP water for textured top
- 2 TBSP turbinado sugar



Directions

- 1. In a large bowl, dissolve sugar in warm water. Add yeast; let stand for 5 minutes.
- 2. Add the canola oil, egg, salt and enough flour to form a soft dough. Knead for 5 minutes.
- 3. Form dough into a smooth ball. Keeping the dough in the bowl, spray with nonstick spray and cover bowl with plastic wrap. Let rise in a warm place for 15-20 minutes.
- 4. Punch down dough. Knead for 1 minute, then divide the dough into 3 samesized portions.
- 5. Roll each out into long logs and set them up on the counter side by side.
- 6. Braid the three pieces of bread together and then pinch together then end pieces and tuck them under the roll. Carefully place the loaf on the parchment paper-lined baking sheet.
- 7. Brush thoroughly with egg mixture and then sprinkle with the turbinado sugar.
- 8. Let the loaf sit while the oven is preheating to 350 degrees F, or about 10 minutes
- 9. Bake for 30-35 minutes, until the outside is golden brown and the internal temperature of the loaf registers 195-200 degrees. Let cool. Slice & enjoy with butter!

Game Review: Dead Space (2023)
