We're hearing a lot about retrofits lately, but what does that word mean?

Retrofits are simply home renovations that make your house more energy-efficient and comfortable all year long. Properly done, they can also save you money and increase your home's value. Federal, Provincial, and Municipal grants and loans are available to help complete the work, especially for income-qualified households.

Let's examine a recently retrofitted single-family house in Radium. The first step was to complete an energy audit to determine which improvements were needed and to help prioritize them. Completed work included adding another layer of insulation in the ceiling, upgrades to the electrical panel, and replacing the propane furnace with a heat pump. Total cost was \$21,500, subtract \$17,500 in rebates received, for a net cost of \$4,000. Not a bad price for a draughty, more comfortable home! The heat pump has the added benefit of filtering the air (think wildfire smoke) and provides air conditioning to help with those hot summer days! No more fluctuating propane bills either, just a steady predictable

electrical bill. Less spent per year on utilities will help pay back the \$4000 invested in 3-5 years, then save money going forward.

So why aren't we all rushing out to retrofit our homes? People are often unaware of the benefits; rebates can be hard to navigate; and qualified contractors are difficult to find. Let your elected officials know that retrofits are important and that you continued and increased access to grants and loans. While you are at it, ask for funding for a retrofit concierge program - a program that helps homeowners navigate the retrofit process from start to finish. Encourage local contractors to become certified so their work will qualify for rebates.
